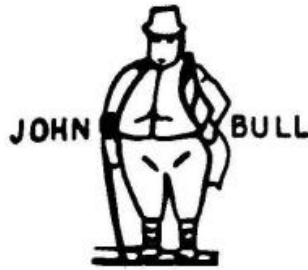

Wilson, Hawksworth, Ellison & Company was one of the first firms to establish a reputation in America in the early 19th century. The company was founded in 1825 by John Wilson and John Wilson Hawksworth, as a merchant in cutlery, razors and steel. The first address was No.4 Sycamore Street. The company name was **Wilson & Hawksworth**.

The company's American representative after 1829 was Joshua Moss, who was so successful that he was offered a partnership in 1832, when the firm's name was changed accordingly, **Wilson, Hawksworth & Moss**. In 1836, the business was moved to No.1 Arundel Lane, Sheffield. Apparently, Wilson rented forging capacity to the partnership at Beeley Wood Works.

In 1846, Joseph Ellison was appointed as American representative, the firm's name becoming **Wilson, Hawksworth, Ellison & Co.**

J. Moss left to establish his own steel and file company, Moss & Gamble Bros.

Wilson died in 1849. In the 1850s, the firm built a new steelworks in the Don Valley. One of the partners at this time included Henry H. Taylor. In 1861, the firm employed 115 workers.

The firm exhibited and won an award for its table cutlery at the Philadelphia Exhibition in 1876. But under the direction of another new partner, Charles William Kayser, knife manufacture was abandoned - a trend hastened by American cutlery tariffs. The company - eventually known as **Kayser, Ellison & Co.** - began a career as one of Sheffield's leading tool steel makers. Its trademarks in the 1880s were a padlock and the words "Manufacturing Union Company".

The firm became **Sanderson Kayser** in 1960 when it merged with Sanderson Brothers and Newbould.

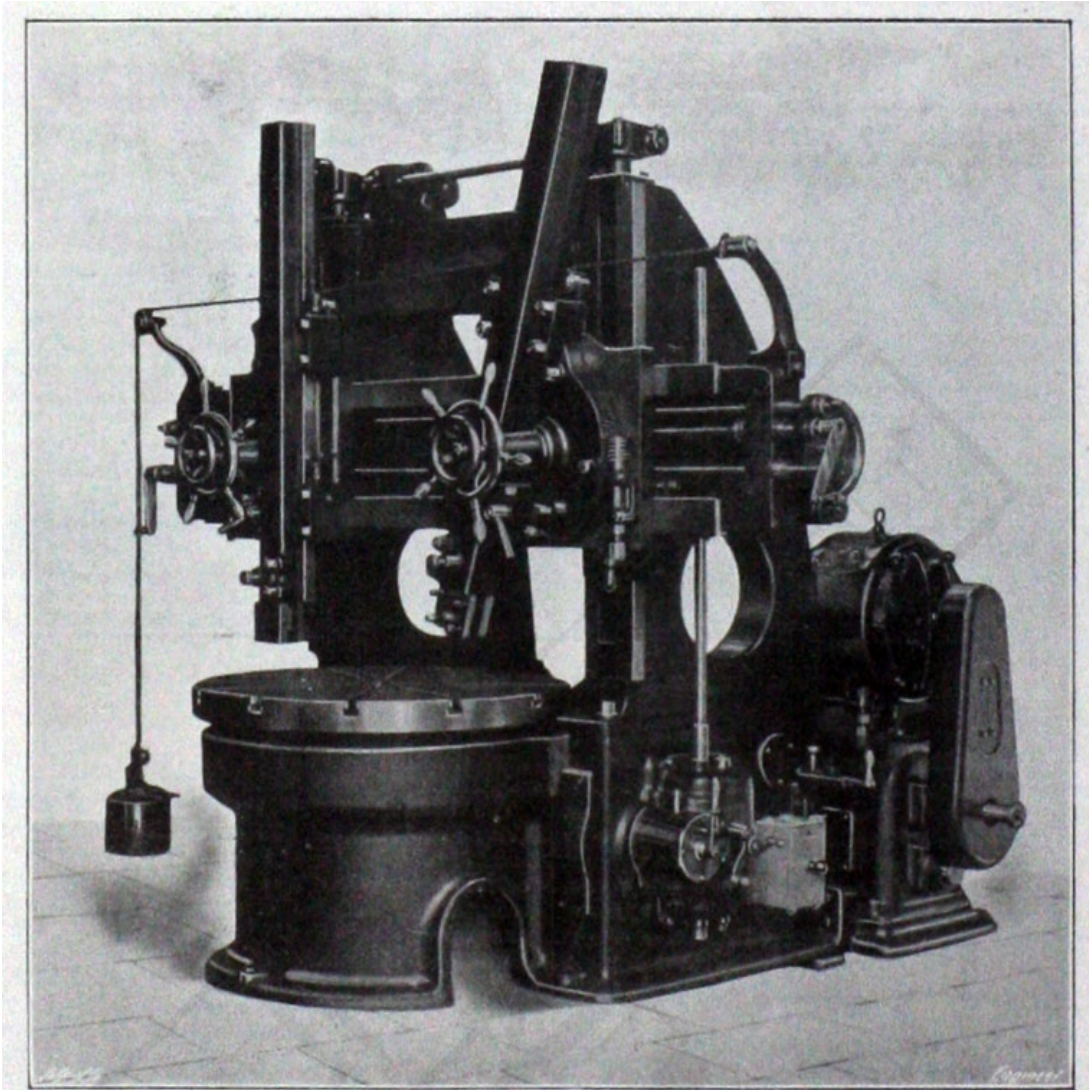


Fig. 42—48-INCH BORING AND TURNING MILL
